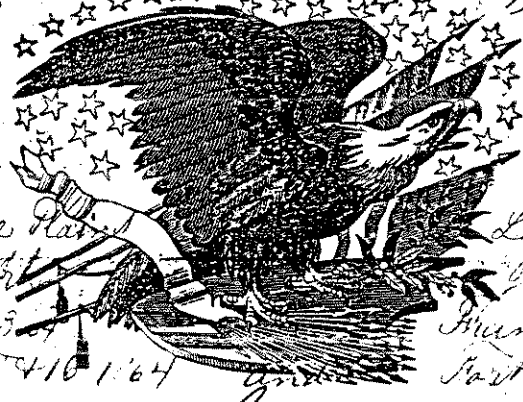
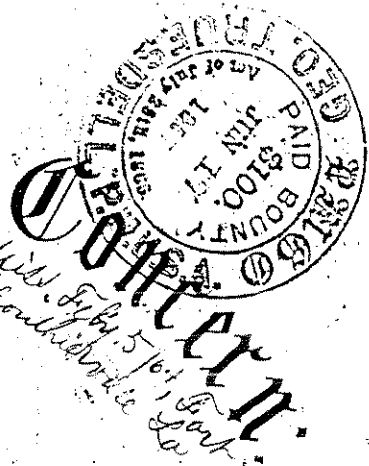

 one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two to serve three years or
 during the war, is hereby **Discharged** from the service of the United States,
 this fifth day of August, 1865, at Camp Butler
Ills. by reason of U. S. No 94 War Department's order 1865.

(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)

Said Louis Hucker was born in
 in the State of Germany, is twenty years of age,
five feet seven inches high, pallor complexion, hazel eyes,
brunet hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a Farmer
